## Pastor's Christmas Message



Christmas this year is on Sunday December 25. What an exciting day to worship Emmanuel, to express the joy of Christ's birth. Christ is born - let the world burst into song this coming Christmas Day! The music of Christmas beckons us to celebrate the miracle of this day. Familiar carols have been playing in the mall, at Wal-Mart, at Kmart for the last month or two, but on Sunday "Christmas Day" is what they sing about - the miracle of the Christ child. The psalmist calls us to "sing ... a new song." Every song that is sung on this coming Christmas Day becomes new. All earth sings to express the joy of Christ's birth.

### **O Come Let Us Adore Him!**

We at Quiet Dell and Monroe Chapel are called to join the song (both ancient and new) of this day. When we sing, we prepare our hearts to receive God's amazing gift - the One who makes all things new. What were Mary and Joseph singing? What were the angels and shepherds singing? What were the animals singing? Did others join the song?

Now comes our turn to join in - to sing the miracle of this coming Christmas Day. No longer do we listen as appreciative observers. Many people and many of you make resolutions on the first day of a new year, but what do you resolve on the first day of a new year? We are beginning a new year, 2012, and we find ourselves poised on the threshold of a new year. You and I already may have made our resolutions, many of which we will break before the first week of the new year is out.

I want to consider a different question: What would your prayers be for Christians across the world as we navigate this important transition into the new year? Let me share a few of mine for both of our churches on the Quiet Dell Charge.

First, I pray that we as Christians approach the new year more determined to live out God's commandments to love God and our neighbor than to make everyone believe exactly the way we do. Second, I pray that Christians would include as neighbors every part of God's creation. Third, I pray that Christians would talk less and do more to respond in love to violence, poverty, hunger, homelessness, loneliness, and hurt. Fourth, I pray that Christians would look for Christ in other cultures and traditions. This practice may protect us from turning Jesus into an idol that simply mirrors ourselves.

I believe that if we, as followers of Jesus, will follow his example in these ways, we will transform our world and this new year into a place and time where God's love reigns. What are your prayers on this first day of the new year?

May God, make us over into the image of His love. May God, help us live out our calling from him as fully as Jesus lived his. May God, help us make the world a place filled with his love.

2. Make sure you have workers each Friday
3. When a worker calls and cannot work on Friday, find a substitute.
4. Attend Harrison County Food Chain Meetings the 3rd Tuesday of each month.
5. For holidays - prepare list for baskets and Angel Tree gifts.
6. Send Thank You cards periodically to those who support our pantry.
7. You must make sure that the treasurer receives all receipts for purchased items.
8. Be responsible for the Postal Drive

Assistant to the Director: (Probably should be a couple as there is a lot of lifting.)

1. See that pantry is stocked with items needed to fill orders. This is done weekly.
2. Shop when needed, whether weekly or monthly.
3. Put food away when you go shopping.
4. Make sure that you are in constant touch with the treasurer.
5. To shop for extra food for the Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Orders.

1. Take care of Angel Tree at Christmas

Second Worker under Assistant:

# A Note from the Finance Committee

2011 has been a tough year financially for everyone. Our government has had problems, many companies have struggled, individuals have been without work and even our church has suffered. In view of this situation, the finance committee is making an effort to more closely watch the churches finances and make recommendations to help improve our fiscal position. One of the ways we intend to do this is to periodically publish the numbers so that the congregation,(a) understands where we are, and (b) has the opportunity to help with the situation, both thru tithes and offerings and offering suggestions for controlling expenses.

As of the end of October, year to date expenses have exceeded collections by \$8,518.00. Thankfully, we started the year with some \$19,000 in the checking account, but that balance has been steadily dwindling throughout the year. As you all know this trend cannot continue. Please be in prayer regarding this and if anyone has suggestions or input, please contact any member of the finance committee, the Administrative Council, or the Pastor. Additionally, if anyone wishes to review the budget or spending information in detail, copies of that information is available for the asking.
